Counselor's Corner:



Over the last several months, students in all grade levels have been learning skills necessary for their social and emotional health through our **Second Step Program**. They are given time to practice these skills here, but students are also asked to complete homework to reinforce the lesson. The homework takes only 5 minutes of your time and it allows you the opportunity to stay engaged in your child's learning and have some conversations about the topics. As a school, we are seeing students use these same skills with their peers. Here are some examples of how these lessons are impacting your child at school.

Once day there was a kindergarten student struggling. Throughout the day friends were reminding friends the steps to calm down and offer strategies (take belly-breaths, count, and self-talk) to help with big emotions. It was great to see a class come together and use what they are learning to help a friend.

After working on the Bullying Prevention program in grades 5-6, students were able to recognize bullying and become supportive bystanders. Students are standing up and reporting any issues they see so other students feel safe and supported.

What to expect from your child's grade level:

K-3rd grade: Students will continue to use the STEP model in "Problem Solving" to solve problems that arise with friends. The **STEP** model is: **S** — Say the problem without blame, **T** — Think of Solutions (safe and respectful), **E** — Explore Consequences (what could happen if), **P** — Pick the Best Solution (make a plan).

4th -5th grade: Students will continue to learn about Emotion Management and what to do when they feel strong emotions. They learn how to **Stop, Name Your Feeling, Calm Down** and the strategies to help them calm down. Some of the strategies taught and practiced are belly breathing, counting, and positive self-talk.

6th grade: Students are finishing the Bullying Prevention Unit where they are learning to **Recognize**, **Report**, and **Refuse** bullying when it happens. This is done by knowing the power and responsibility of a bystander.

Young 5's: Students are finishing up their safety unit with Internet Safety and Personal Safety. Internet safety just teaches students not to give out personal information and staying on sites that are appropriate for their age. Personal Safety will deal with safe and unsafe touches.


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Calling all 5" and 6" Graders...
