Kindergarten: Students are finishing up the Bullying Prevention Unit. About midway through April, students will transition into the Child Protection Unit, which most grade levels have already started. (This information is listed below). ** Bullying is when someone keeps being mean to someone else on purpose. The person it is

happening to hasn't been able to make it stop. It is unfair and one-sided.

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Four Key Parts to this Definition: 1. Doesn't Stop 2. Repeated 3. One-Sided 4. Purpose 1 st — 5 th Grade: Students will start the Child Protection Unit. You will receive a letter that will have a code for you to get more information about what your child will learn. Here is a brief overview: 1. Ways to Stay Safe 2. Always Ask 1 st Rule 3. Safe/Unsafe and Unwanted Touches 4. How to Refuse and Report Unsafe and Unwanted Touches.

6 th Grade: Students are finishing up conflict resolution. Students will learn how to solve challenging conflicts and how to make amends. These steps aren't easy, but it will help them solve conflicts between friends and empower them to make positive decisions. When solving a conflict, students will need to come up with a safe and respectful solution and identify consequences for each. Then, students will learn that sometimes an apology isn't enough. Sometimes they will have to repair the harm caused within a conflict.
