Students in grades K-5 are continuing to learn some very important social skills that will help students learn to get along with others and do better in school. The key focus is Emotion Management. Students learn about strong emotions and how to keep them under control. During the lessons, students get to see each step being used, practice the skills and learn through a song. In some lessons, students get an opportunity to practice with parents at home by completing the Home Link worksheet.

Here is an example of the steps students are using to calm down.

- 1. Stop use your signal
- Name your feeling
- Calm down (belly breaths, counting, and positive self-talk)

In our 6th grade classes, students will discuss internet safety and the dangers that could occur when we start talking with strangers online. During the classroom guidance lesson, we discuss how to remain safe online and a few rules we should follow.

- 1. Never give out personal information: Name, address, phone number, birthday, and school.
- 2. If you receive a threatening email or uncomfortable request, students should save the evidence,
- don't respond, block the individual, and tell a trusted adult.
- Don't share photos of yourself, family, or home with people you meet online.
- 4. Never make plans to meet an online friend in person.

We also discuss how important it is to talk with parents/guardians about what we are doing online, and we should share our user names and passwords with our parents/quardians. This helps keep students safe and honest.

Our young 5's will continue working on our safety unit.
