

Counselor's Corner

February is an exciting month. Not just because it is Valentine's Day and guidance lessons, but the elementary guidance department is partnering with FFA on some future activities. Students will have opportunities for Random Acts of Kindness and other events sponsored by Houston High School FFA chapter. Ask your child about any new events

In grades K-3, students will finish our safety unit on safe and unsafe touches. These grade appropriate lessons discuss how physical touches such as a high five, fist bump, hug and hand shake can all be welcomed touches that make us feel good; however, there are other touches that make us feel scared or cause us to feel uncomfortable. These unwelcomed touches can be in the form of hitting or touching our private parts (parts covered by a bathing suit). Students are encouraged to follow 3 steps.

Shout Run Tell

With some of the grade levels doing more than one lesson a month, students may be a little ahead of other grade level; therefore, students in those grade levels will focus on tattling verses telling. By looking at tattling, students figure out other ways to solve situations besides always telling an adult. Rules we follow are:

Be a Danger Ranger
Be a Problem Solver
Is it a Now or Later Problem
MYOB – Mind your own beeswax

The rest of our students will look at problem solving in a different way. Fourth grade students will look at problems as Big Deal vs. Little Deal and how does our reaction match the size of our problem. Sometimes it is just a change of perspective and looking at other ways to deal with the problem. Fifth grade students will focus on conflict resolution. This is a great skill to have when we run into an issue with a friend. Regardless of the title, students will have some strategies to use when solving problems.

Students in the sixth grade will complete their career lesson. Earlier, students looked at careers that matched their skills and abilities. Now students will look at the careers and discover the skills they need and how it relates to school success. Hopefully with this perspective on careers students will see how their academic success is related to their goals for later in life.
