Our students are continuing to work hard on our Second Step lessons that focus on social and emotional learning. This month, most students will finish up their last unit on "Solving Problems". They will follow the STEP model which is: S — Say the problem without blame, T — Think of Solutions (safe and respectful), E — Explore Consequences (what could happen if), P — Pick the Best Solution (make a plan). The skills previously learned are being implemented into these lessons as well, so it is important that your student completes the homework that reinforces these skills. Near the end of February, students will be learning some other important skills that are really important for discussion at home. You will be provided a letter that has a Home Link code, so a discuss more about these topics. Here is what is happening in your student's class.

Kindergarten — 5 th Grade

Students are finishing up with the Problem Solving Unit. Kindergarten has more lessons than the other grades, so it will take them longer to finish up. Students grades 1-5 will start Bullying Prevention Unit half way through the month, but for now, here are the problem solving STEPS.

- Problem Solving
- 1. Say the Problem without Blame
- 2. Think of Solutions 3. Explore Consequences
- 4. Pick the Best Solution



Students are continuing to work on conflict resolution, and at the end of the month, they will have a guest speaker that will be talking with them about the SAVE Students Act, a law that the state of Ohio passed for students in grades 6-12. Parents will receive more information on this through Final Forms.
