January 18: No school





For the month of January, most grade levels will finish with the safety unit. This lesson will focus on personal safety (welcome and unwelcome touches) and personal rights.

These grade appropriate lessons discuss how physical touches such as a high five, fist bump, hug and hand shake can all be welcomed touches that make us feel good; however, there are other touches that make us feel scared or cause us to feel uncomfortable. These unwelcomed touches can be in the form of hitting or touching our private parts (parts covered by a bathing suit). Kids are encouraged to talk to a trusted adult if they receive an unsafe touch.

Other grade levels that have finished the safety unit will look at problem solving skills. Our 6th grade students will spend the next 2-3 guidance lessons creating personal short term and long term goals.
