# 3<sup>rd</sup> Graders Help the Earth!

At the beginning of the school year, third graders dropped off boxes and explained the program to classrooms in the elementary. All year, whenever a student had a dried up marker, they put the marker in the "colorcycle" box, instead of the trash can. Monday, May 6<sup>th</sup>, third graders will be collecting the boxes of used markers from the classrooms. Students will weigh the markers to see how many pounds of used markers they saved from going into the landfill. Third grade will then mail the boxes of used markers to Crayola for recycling where they will be turned into clean energy. The third graders have loved starting this program at our school. They hope this program will continue for years to come as we do our part to help the Earth.
