Counselor Corner



For the month of October, most grade levels will focus on the word "friendship". Friendship looks different at every stage of life, but students struggle to develop positive, healthy friendships. Over the course of this month and into the following months, students will learn building blocks on what friendship is, how to build lasting friendships, recognize signs of unhealthy friendships, and conflict resolution. In some grade levels, students have already started looking at the basic skills, and as October approaches, we will have more topics related to the building blocks of healthy friendships. Here is what to expect in each grade level.

Young 5's - Our young 5's group began with a lesson on respecting others personal space and will continue to work on some character education building blocks before moving into creating friendships.

Kindergarten – Individuals in our kindergarten classes are starting with feelings. Research shows that students are struggling with identifying feelings and appropriate ways to handle feelings. In the first lesson, students were taught how to talk about their feelings to others and practiced with their peers.

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The next lesson we will identify signs that our body produces as we feel these emotions and some strategies to regulate our emotions. In turn, creating better communication for friendships.

 1^{st} Grade - Students in first grade are learning the characteristics of friends by using the acronym HIPPO ($\underline{\textbf{\textit{H}}}$ onest, $\underline{\textbf{\textit{I}}}$ nclude, $\underline{\textbf{\textit{P}}}$ ositive Words, $\underline{\textbf{\textit{P}}}$ eaceful Problem Solving, and $\underline{\textbf{\textit{O}}}$ bserve Feelings). Looking for strong character to develop friendships and even becoming more confident to make new friends.

 2^{nd} - 4^{th} Grade - Students within this grade band are looking at ways to start a friendship. During the most recent lesson, students learned 6 steps to making a new friend, and they had the opportunity to practice these steps in class. Steps include: 1. Observe, 2. Introduce, 3. Invite, 4. Ask Questions, 5. Listen, and Continue. In October, students will learn how to maintain and grow healthy friendships.

5th-6th Grade - Individuals in 5th and 6th grade have started the school year off with creating SMART goals. This was to help give students a specific focus for their school year while understanding the process of goal setting. Students could focus their goal toward personal, social, academic, or career. As we move into the following months, students will see how their goals are tied to a number of topics covered within guidance lessons.
