With another school year, there is a lot of excitement in the air about students returning back to school and newthings taking place. Along with the traditional counseling services (individual, small group, and classroom guidance for academic, career, and social/emotional development to all students), we have partnered with Catholic Social Services (CSS) to provide support for our students and teachers with teaching social and emotional curriculum

In grades K-2, we will use the Second-Step Program to teach critical skills. The skills are taught from four areas: Skills for Learning, Empathy, Emotion Management, and Problem Solving. They will learn a lot this year, and teachers will also complete daily practice activities to help your child retain skills.

We have had our first 2 weeks of school already. Things are running smoothly. The students are getting a lot of assessment so that the teachers can make instructional decisions. We also need to determine which K-3 students will need the additional support of Title 1 reading and who will need to have a Reading Improvement and Monitoring Plan. If either or both of these apply to your child, you will be informed. You are always encouraged to be an active participant in your child's education, so feel free to ask questions of your child's teacher(s) at any time throughout the year.

In grades 3–5, students will continue to build their skills from the four previously taught areas (Skills for Learning, Empathy/Respect, Emotion Management, and Problem Solving). Within the next month, students in these grade levels will learn about listening with attention, being assertive, and respecting difference. These social skills will be practiced throughout the week here at school and at home.

In our 6 th grade classes, we will be talking about social inclusion and respecting self and others
