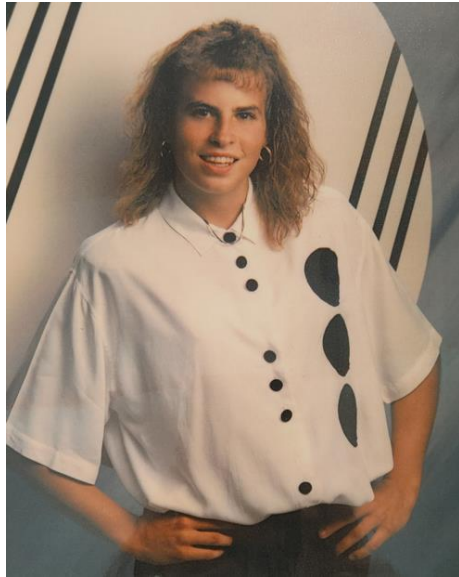




Hardin-Houston Wall of Honor

Stacey Ritter was a 1992 graduate of Houston High School and a 1997 graduate of Robert Morris University with a degree in Business Administration. She is widely considered to be the best athlete to ever attend Houston High School.

Stacey was a four-year member of the basketball team. She is the all-time leading scorer for Houston High School with 1566 points in her career. She also holds the Season FG record with 196 field goals in the 1990-1991 season. She was team MVP multiple times and voted the Shelby County Player of the Year.

Stacey was also a four-year member of the track team. She holds the school long jump record with a jump of 18'5.25", the 100m dash record with a time of 12.2 seconds, the 200m dash record with a time of 25.54 seconds, the 400m dash record with a time of 59.4 seconds, and was part of the 4x200m relay record. She won events at every level from county, district, regional, and concluding with winning the 200m dash, the long jump, finishing 2nd in the 100m dash, and 6th in the 400m dash at the 1992 State meet which culminated with a team runner-up place.

Stacey was also a four-year member of the cross-country team and made it to the state cross-county meet every year.

Stacey first attended the University of Rio Grande and was a member of the Women's Basketball team. She was the MOC Conference Freshman of the Year, 1st team MOC Bevo Francis Tournament, David Lipscomb All Tourney Team, Great Lakes All Region Team, and participated in the NAIA Women's National Basketball Championship. She was a member of the MOC Conference Championship teams of 1993 and 1994.

Stacey then attended Robert Morris University, an NCAA Division 1 member of the Northeastern Conference at that time. In 1996, while a member of the Women's Basketball team, she was named the team MVP after leading the team in steals, assists, 2nd in scoring, and 2nd in rebounding. She was also named to the 1997 Northeastern All Conference 2nd team.

Stacey scored a total of 1335 points for her college career at both the University of Rio Grande and Robert Morris University.
