Welcome back! This 2025 August Cat Chat will be filled with numerous informational items as we approach the start of the 2025-2026 school year. Our outstanding maintenance staff has been busy all summer cleaning and getting the building and campus ready for students and staff for the 15th year! One major project that is in motion at this time is the athletic complex parking lot and renovations to field #1. Both projects should be completed by mid-September and will provide the needed handicap accessible parking and drainage upgrades that will be used by several generations to come. The district also completed several preventative maintenance projects over the summer, one such is sealing all concrete surfaces and fixing a few sidewalks on campus. A second project was the replacement of our well pump and its associated electrical panel, which was near end-of-life capacity.

As a district we are once again pleased to announce that school supplies, excluding book bags and headphones, will be provided this school year. Please wait to purchase these headphones until you have talked to your child's teacher at open house, especially at the elementary grade levels. This change should alleviate stress and minimize the costs for parents at the beginning of the school year. Students and visitors to the building will see two new flatscreens for student recognition. This new initiative will illuminate past graduates and current student successes, in addition to upcoming events within the school district throughout the school year. Last, but not least, this year is the fourth and final phase of our district's one-one initiative. All students in grades 5-12 will be provided a school issued Chromebook!

Lunch Prices for 2025-2026

The Hardin-Houston School District modified lunch prices for the upcoming school year. K-6: \$2.00; 7-12: \$2.25; Reduced Lunch: \$0.40; Breakfast: \$1.25; Reduced Breakfast: \$0.30; Milk: \$0.35. As in the past, JH & HS students must use their online lunch account for Coffee Bar and ala Carte items. Free and reduced applications need to be filled out this year and are available in the Principal's Office. Children from families whose annual income is at or below the federal guidelines are eligible for free and reduced-price meals and school fee waivers.

FCCLA National Leadership Conference

Over the summer, two members of the Houston Family, Career, and Community Leaders of America (FCCLA) chapter, along with adviser, Mrs. Abby Pleiman, had the opportunity to attend and compete in various competitive events, known as STAR Events, at the FCCLA National Conference held in Orlando, Florida.

Tara Haverfield and Kayson Hines competed in Entrepreneurship. This event recognizes participants who develop a plan for a small business using Family and Consumer Sciences skills and sound business practices. The business must relate to an area of Family and Consumer Sciences education or related occupations. They created the business, Fetch, a pet sitting business. They competed at the regional level earning a silver rating and also qualified for the state competition. At state, they received a gold rating and 2nd place, which qualified them to the FCCLA National Conference. At the National Conference, Tara and Kayson received another gold rating and were recognized as a Top 10 National Finalist!



Houston FFA Happenings

Houston FFA ended the school year with great success! Students attended the State FFA Convention where the chapter was recognized for their charitable donations of \$500 or more along with the 24-25 chapter secretary, treasurer and reporter being recognized for their gold rated officers books. Six students participated in the State FFA Band and Chorus for the first time and are looking forward to participating again next year.

Coming back from convention, students conducted our annual recognition banquet with highlights from the night being Steve Mowery awarded the Honorary Chapter Degree, our senior awards being presented to Mekayla Pleiman for Attitude, Dylan Shaffer for Teamwork and Lilli McClenen for Leadership and the 2025-2026 officers being installed into their respective positions.

Field day was the last event of the year for freshmen through seniors with classes cheering on their classmates as they

competed in various events. The winning class wins bragging rights for a whole year. The winning class this year was the seniors!

Our new officer team worked together to mulch the Houston Church as a bonding/ teamwork activity. As summer winds down and preparations for a new school year begin, we extend a warm welcome back to all Houston students and families. We hope everyone enjoyed a relaxing and refreshing break. With the 2025–26 school year just around the corner, there's plenty to look forward to—and important information to share.

Fall sports officially kick off on August 1, and anticipation is building for another competitive season. Before student-athletes can participate, several requirements must be met. Both students and parents must complete the OHSAA preseason materials through FinalForms. Additionally, OHSAA mandates that both the athlete and a parent attend one in-person meeting per year. This year's fall meetings will be held at 6:00 PM on both Monday, July 28 and Monday, August 4. Attending one of these sessions will fulfill the requirement for the entire school year, regardless of

which sport or season the student participates in. While additional meetings will be available for winter and spring sports, attending this fall is strongly encouraged.

As we prepare for the start of school, we also invite all families to join us for our annual Open House on August 12. This event provides an opportunity to meet teachers, explore classrooms, and set a positive tone for the year. We look forward to reconnecting with returning families and welcoming new faces into the Wildcat community.

To support school spirit and simplify event entry, Houston is offering student t-shirts and athletic passes. Student t-shirts are available for \$25 each, and with its purchase, students wearing any Houston shirt can attend any home athletic event for just \$1. In addition, athletic passes are available for students at \$50 and adults at \$100. Senior passes are free for Houston residents aged 65 or older, and any senior pass issued last year remains valid for the upcoming year with no renewal required.

For those unable to attend games in person, Houston athletics will continue streaming home events held in the high school and auxiliary gyms via Hudl TV. Fans can subscribe annually for \$80, monthly for \$25, or purchase access to individual games for \$7. The Athletic Department is also preparing a new display for the hallway in the high school gym, where we will honor all Houston athletes who have qualified for state competition in golf, track & field or cross country. The 2024–25 spring sports season was one for the record books! Makenna Vondenhuevel had an outstanding softball season, breaking the school's single-season strikeout record with 262 and earning the title of SCAL Player of the Year.

On the track, Autumn Ritter shattered the school's 200-meter dash record with a time of 25.47 seconds and set a new SCAL record in the 100-meter dash at 12.25 seconds. Her speed earned her a trip to the state meet in both events. Meanwhile, Emilee Earl rewrote the record books in girls track and field. She broke school records in discus with a throw of 137 feet 8 inches, pole vault with a height of 11 feet 8 inches, and shot put with a throw of 43 feet 9.5 inches. She also set SCAL meet records in both the pole vault and shot put. Emilee's dominant season earned her SCAL Player of the Year honors, and she qualified for the state meet in all three events. At the state meet, she earned state runner-up titles in both shot put and discus, and she finished 5th in state in pole vault. Alongside her teammates Autumn Ritter, Lexi Hartings, and Olivia Burks, Emilee helped set a new school record in the 4x100 meter relay with a time of 50.98 seconds.

These accomplishments reflect the hard work and dedication of our athletes, coaches, and supporters, and they serve as inspiration as we look forward to the year ahead.

As we step into a new academic and athletic year, the excitement is building. From the classroom to the competition field, the Houston Wildcats are ready to make the 2025–26 school year one to remember - Go Cats!
