Important information regarding grades for Educere Students

The first quarter ends on Thursday October 15, 2020.

All students utilizing the Educere - remote learning option are responsible for having 50% of every course completed by the end of the first grading period.

Assuming a student has completed 50% (or more) of their course by October 15, they will earn the percentage grade and letter grade equivalent for their course.

If the student has not completed at least 50%, then the course percentage grade will be docked accordingly.

Here is an example:

Ben has 5 classes on Educere. Note the current progress and quarter grades.

| Class | Current grade (% / letter) | Current progress (%) | Quarter grade (% / letter) |
|----------------|----------------------------|----------------------|----------------------------|
| English | 80 / C | 50 | 80 / C |
| Math | 80 / C | 45 (5% below) | 75 / C (dock 5 points) |
| Science | 92 / B | 55 (5% ahead) | 92 / B (no adjustment) |
| Social Studies | 93 / A | 35 (15 % below) | 78 / C (dock 15 points) |
| Music | 70 / C | 43 (7% below) | 63 / F (dock 7 points) |

Therefore, it is vital that students reach the 50% completion mark by October 15. Even if a student has a good running percentage grade, if they do not have at least 50% of the course finished by that date, their grade may be lowered for the quarter. Please be advised that the acknowledgement form that all parents signed set the expectation that students should work on school work and average 5 hours a day 5 days a week.

Remember, percentage grades at the end of each quarter are used in determining the final grades for a given course. Final grades are used to award credits in High School, and to determine what students need summer school in Junior High.
