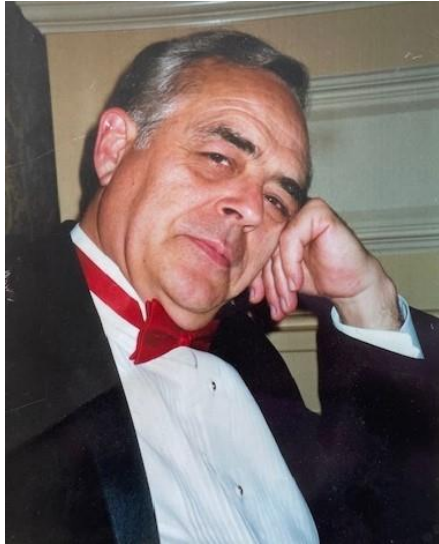




## Hardin-Houston Wall of Honor
